3. Find the population of New York City and round the number to the nearest hundred thousand.
4. The Statue of Liberty is a fun place to visit. The Statue was not made in New York as it was a gift. If the Vessel had to bring the Statute from the place where it was built and go back home, how many miles would this ship travel?
5. The largest storage of gold is in the financial district in NYC. About how many (millions of pounds) of gold are on Wall Street?
6. New York is famous for its Broadway Theatres. If each theatre had a play that was 4.5 hours, how many hours of plays would there be on Broadway?
